The southern European countries suffer from the worst post-war economic and financial crisis, with major social consequences. Especially the younger generation has bleak outlooks for their future. Some look for individual solutions such as jobs in faraway countries in and outside Europe (Brazil, Angola). To what extent are individuals returning to their own communities (family, religious communities, village communities), which become increasingly important taking up their 'traditional' role as support structure for the victims of the current crisis?

**Enrique Lluch Frechina** is currently Professor of Economics and economics ethics at the University CEU Cardenal Herrera in Valencia. He is a member of the Scientific Council of the FOESSA Foundation with whom he works together on reports on the social situation in Spain. He further directs the Centre for Research on Poverty and Exclusion in the Valencia Region.
